Our Pastor Writes...

Greetings,

I am thrilled to be writing this to you as your new pastor. Jill and I are thankful that the Lord has brought our family here to Harrisburg and to Tupelo. We are looking forward to building relationships with you and becoming a part of what God is doing in our church and in our community. We are humbled at the way you have reached out to us and received us over the last few weeks. Thank you again for the good ole Mississippi hospitality that you have shown, there is nothing quite like it anywhere else in the world!

As I write my first Herald article, I hope that this benefits your walk with the Lord, encourages the church, and strengthens our relationships with one another. This month let's consider the sermon passage that we looked at on August 27, 2017 and how it can further impact everyday life.

"¹² Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. ¹³ Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. ¹⁵ Let those of us who are mature think this way, and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal that also to you. ¹⁶ Only let us hold true to what we have attained."

- *Philippians 3:12-16*

This passage challenges each of us to consider our spiritual maturity. In verse 15 Paul points out that those who are spiritually mature have a unique perspective on life. Mature Christians think about everything in light of God's call, and because of that pursue faithfulness to God's call to live by faith in Christ.

A few years ago Dustin Willis and Aaron Coe co-wrote "Life on Mission: Joining the Everyday Mission of God." To help explain the Gospel they use the Three Circles which illustrates that God saves us from our sin through the cross of Christ to the lifelong pursuit of recovering His good design. This truth is at the heart of what Paul is saying in Philippians 3 regarding how mature believers think and live because of their growing relationship with God.

You and I have been saved to the lifelong pursuit of living on mission for God in every facet of life and relationship we have. Paul writes in verse 16 that the church should hold true to what it has attained, and what they have attained is a new life through faith in Jesus. Therefore, as you go about the everyday things of marriage, work, parenting, and relationships consider your approach. Are you pursuing faithfulness to God? Is there something that you need to change or repent of in your pursuit of recovering God's design for your life?

I am praying that as a church we will pursue God's design as we press on toward the goal of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus together.
