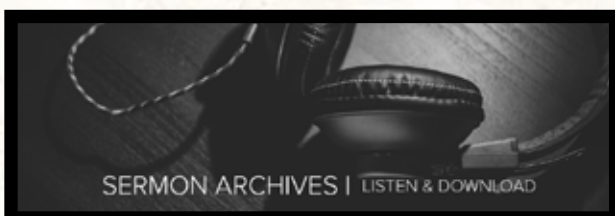
During the summer I spent some time asking God for direction concerning our Sunday morning worship services and Wednesday night Bible Studies. I believe the Lord was gracious to give me answers and I want to share with you where we are going during the next couple of months.

Foundations: The Church (*September 9, 16, 23, & 30*) After Easter we introduced an ongoing sermon series in April entitled, "Foundations: Sermons on Christ as the Cornerstone of Life, the Family, and the Church. Our foundation focus in September will be on the church. I am looking forward to what God will do as we examine what the Bible says about things like preaching, church leadership, and more.

Unspoken: Things we struggle with but don't talk about at church. (*Starts October 7*) A few years ago I sat through a prayer meeting and listened as person after person raised their hands and simply said the word "unspoken" as their prayer request. From that point on I have had an increasing burden for those the church to be a place where grace is preached and experienced. I agree that not every moment is the right time to voice a difficult or sensitive prayer request. However, I believe there is a need for the church to address many of the difficult things we struggle with from the pulpit so that we can learn from Scripture how to work through or begin working through the things we don't talk about at church. The sermon series will address struggles like depression, finances, marriage, doubting your faith, and more. I don't believe that I have all the answers to our struggles, but I do know the One who is our answer to our struggles and His name is Jesus. Join me now and begin praying for God to use this sermon series and our Foundations series to grow us and use us here in Tupelo and to the ends of the Earth.

I am looking forward to how God will use our time in worship on Sundays in the coming months. Know that I am praying "that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened to that you may know what is the hope of his calling, what is the wealth of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the might working of his strength." (*Ephesians 1:18-20*)

Most people in my circle of friends would say this is their favorite time of year. The weather becomes more comfortable, football is happening, days afield are enjoyed, and it is the on ramp to Christmas. We enjoy a routine when school is in session and it is nice to have a rhythm to our days. I hope you find this Fall to be great for you and your family. As you enjoy the activities offered this time of year, please consider joining us on a mission opportunity.

As you know, last year Hurricanes were prevalent, and we were among those who responded to help. We went to Houston and Puerto Rico and have plans to continue those efforts. Our focus will be in Puerto Rico and we will partner again with 8 Days of Hope in Houston.

There are still tens of thousands of homes with a tarp on the roof in Puerto Rico and we are heading down there December 27- January 2. Sign up is available online and we would love to have you come and serve with us. We will be involved in clean up and rebuilding efforts and we are taking any medical/dental professionals willing to work a clinic while we are there. Harrisburg has a great reputation among the people of Puerto Rico, we have sent three teams down there so far, each time we see God at work. The Student Ministry, Zamar and a Missions team have served and impacted Puerto Rico with the Gospel. Let's continue!

We will be working through our church partner in Cayey and continuing to help pastor Juan reach his community with the Gospel. Our accommodations are secured through our partnership with the North American Mission Board. The cost of the trip is roughly \$1,000.

We are also heading out to Las Vegas December 5-10. Harrisburg has partnered with a couple of church plants in Vegas and we are going out to help one of them launch their beginning worship services. New Thing Church is pastored by Michael Horner and they have been working toward this launch for a couple of years. Come join us as we help them do some outreach and inviting to the new church. Michael will utilize us to work with him serving a local school, prayer walking the community, hosting a meal, and help with the setup and take down of the service. The lostness in the Western portion of our nation is staggering and we are blessed to be a part of reaching the West for Jesus. This trip will cost roughly \$750. Online registration is available.
